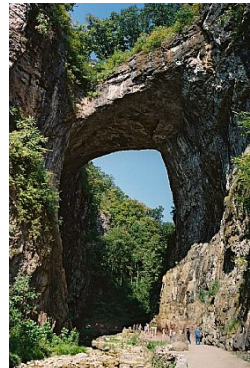

## Monday, May 14

Depart early morning from Woodsville, Littleton and Plymouth (other departures TBA). Sit back and relax onboard your luxurious motorcoach with your Plymouth Travel Tour Director and Woodsville Guaranty Savings Bank Representative. Stops will be made throughout the day for rest breaks and lunch. Enjoy fun, movies and games en route. Your day ends with an **included dinner** and overnight accommodations in the Harrisburg-area. (Hampton Inn, Hilton Garden, or similar) *Meal: D*

## Tuesday, May 15

After an **included breakfast**, travel to **Gettysburg** where the history of the Civil War comes alive through a narrated tour of the National Military Park's battlefields and a visit to the museum. Have lunch on your own before continuing to Winchester, VA to the **Museum of the Shenandoah Valley**.

This regional history museum complex also includes the **Glen Burnie Historic House** and six acres of spectacular gardens. There is something for everyone here: European, American, and Shenandoah Valley furniture, decorative arts, and paintings; an amazing collection of furnished miniature houses and rooms; state-of-the-art audio and video presentations and more. The **Glen Burnie Gardens** are among the most beautiful public gardens in Virginia.



Next check into your Winchester, VA area hotel (Hilton Garden Inn, Fairfield Inn or similar), to freshen up before dinner. Enjoy dinner this evening at **The Wayside Inn**, "serving travelers since 1797". Dine in one of eight antique-filled rooms featuring authentic Colonial favorites. *Meals: B,D*

## Wednesday, May 16



Depart, after an **included breakfast**, for Front Royal, VA and enter into the **Shenandoah National Park**. The park's scenic byway, Skyline Drive, runs 105 miles north and south along the crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains and is the only public road through the park. The drive features over 75 overlooks providing spectacular views of nature's handiwork. Pass by rock cliffs, vistas, and perhaps some wildlife. Drive through tunnels of trees, past wildflowers, ferns, and banks of mountain laurel in bloom.

After lunch on your own in downtown Staunton, visit the **Museum of American Frontier Culture**. This extraordinary outdoor living history museum features four authentic working farms illustrating the rich European influence on America's cultural tradition. The American farmstead from Shenandoah Valley reflects the blending of the culture our ancestors brought to America.

Next, a short drive brings us to the Lexington area for check in at The **Natural Bridge Hotel**. Amidst the Blue Ridge Mountains the hotel offers beautiful views and is renowned for its southern hospitality since Thomas Jefferson's era. This historic hotel is adjacent to Virginia's natural wonder, the **Natural Bridge**.

Tonight, enjoy an **included drink** in the Red Fox Tavern, followed by dinner in the hotel's Colonial Dining Room. Afterwards, enjoy the Mount Vernon-like veranda with its panoramic mountain views or stroll the surrounding grounds. *Meals: B,D*

## Thursday, May 17

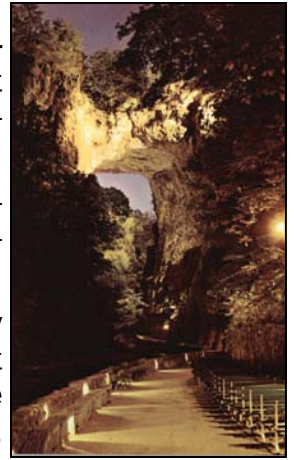


Following an **included breakfast**, depart for Bedford, VA, the town that suffered the highest per capita D-Day losses in the nation. Here experience "One of the most moving Memorials". With its stylized English Garden, haunting invasion tableau, and striking Victory Plaza, the **D-Day Memorial** stands as a powerful permanent tribute to the valor, fidelity, and sacrifice of the participants.

Following lunch on your own, return to Lexington for a guided Campus tour of the **Virginia Military Institute & the VMI Cadet Museum**. Founded in 1839, it is the oldest state-supported military college in the nation. The VMI's Cadet Barracks is a National Historic Landmark.

Next enjoy a tour and tasting at the **Lexington Valley Vineyard**, Rockbridge Baths, located on 67 rolling, scenic acres in the Shenandoah Valley. This family-owned winery produces handcrafted wines from French-American hybrid varieties.

This evening's **included dinner** is in the hotel's Colonial Dining Room. Then enjoy time at the **Natural Bridge** and the **Drama of Creation**. On May 22, 1927, President Calvin Coolidge pressed the button that inaugurated the night illumination of the Natural Bridge. Tonight, with the aid of an impressive system of lighting and sound, the bridge and glen transform into a marvel of living stone. *Meals: B,D*



### Friday, May 18



Enjoy an **included breakfast** at the hotel this morning before check out. Then depart for Raphine, VA and visit the **Cyrus McCormick farm**, the inventor of the reaper which revolutionized agriculture. Enjoy the museum, blacksmith shop, and grist mill. A stop will also be made at nearby **Wade's Mill**. Built in the 1750's, the mill produces a variety of stone ground flours available for sale in the shop.

After lunch, en route, stop in Mount Crawford, VA at the **Green Valley Bookfair**. Enjoy this discount book outlet that features over 500,000 new books at incredible bargain prices. Save 60-90% off retail on over 30,000 different titles in more than 60 different categories.

Later, arrive at Baltimore, MD's **Inner Harbor**, nationally acclaimed for its extraordinary waterfront development. Enjoy free time for dinner on your own. Overnight in a Baltimore, MD area hotel. *Meals: B*

### Saturday, May 19

The fun doesn't end on this last day of the tour - see what surprises your Tour Director has in store for today. Stops will be made for rest breaks and an **included lunch** on the way home. *Meal: B,L*
